
New Offices

France

Tim and Monique Baynes Clarke are pictured here at a recent meeting of FIC's international directors and representatives with one of their



favourite verses projected onto the screen.

It's a highly appropriate verse for where they are right now. Having heard a clear call to establish an FIC office in France, they are waiting for the Lord to open the door. Specifically they are waiting for the right property to use as a small conference centre to train leaders and as a B&B business to provide an income. We sense that the Lord will prompt someone to make available a property (or funds to buy a property) for a period of 5 to 10 years to get the ministry established after which we will give the property (or money) back. It's a case of saying, as the disciples once said to a person who owned a donkey, "The Master needs it."

While they have been waiting, the Lord has used them magnificently. Tim has revamped our "Helping Others" course and they have helped many churches get up and running. But the Church in France is desperate for them to come and get started. Like the Psalmist we say "How long?" But God is faithful - He will do it. And what a story it will make!

South Africa

When Jonothan Christie first came across FIC, he and his wife Gloria were pastoring seven Zulu speaking congregations and one English speaking congregation. In September 2000. Gloria was diagnosed



with epilepsy. She died little under three months later after two successive seizures.

That was a bitter blow for Jonothan and daughters Sandy (25) and Michelle (24). You might think that it would have put paid to any thoughts he had of starting a FIC office. However, the God of all comfort stepped in. Several miracles later, the Lord led Ionothan to Sandy, a lady who had been on her own journey of healing with the Lord's help. They were married and daughter Sarah was born in September 2006.

Jonothan is currently the full-time pastor of Trinity Methodist Church in Durban. He is already promoting FIC. He says, "I have been receiving numerous e-mails and phone calls concerning FIC, but being attached to the church restricts how much I can do." The UK office has oversight of South Africa and we are praying that the Lord will release funds to enable Jonothan to devote more time to establishing FIC. Could you help? We will happily forward gifts on to Jonothan and Sandy.

Over the years we have not asked for specific financial support. However, we wanted to make you aware of the need to support those whom God has called to serve Him in FIC.

We see the work of FIC in resourcing the UK Church as strategic kingdom building and have produced a brochure outlining our vision. Would you read it through and consider whether you could offer regular financial support as an individual or as part of your church's giving?

Setting Your Community Free

Steve Goss explains FIC's assertion that there is no reason that we should not bring about a change in the "spiritual climate" in our communities.

In our recently published vision document (pictured right) we make the bold claim that there is nothing to stop the Church "setting the UK on fire". But is that true or just some sort of pie in the sky triumphalism?

Let me outline the Biblical principles we have based that assertion on.

1. God has already given His Church everything she needs to fulfil the Great Commission

What is the spiritual climate of your area like? Dark probably – but is it darker than the occult environment faced by the early Church?

That's the environment in which Jesus said to a handful of people with no obvious resources, "Go into all the world and make disciples". Because He would not issue a command without also supplying the means to fulfil it, He also said, "all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Mt. 28:18), in effect conferring on us the power and authority needed to fulfil that Great Commission.

Paul tells us (Eph. 1) that we have "incomparably great power", and "every spiritual blessing". We are seated with Christ "far above all rule and authority, power and dominion."

That is why Jesus can say, "I will build my church, and the gates of Hell will not overcome it" (Mt. 16:18). We have everything we need.

2. Genuine unity is a prerequisite for wielding power and authority

The big question for us is why the early church saw thousands of people becoming Christians but we do not. There are only a few parameters: God, Satan, people and the Church. Which have changed?

God is the same yesterday, today and for ever. He wants all people everywhere to be saved.

Satan is no more evil or powerful. He has been overpowered and disarmed (Col. 2:15). He is defeated and cannot stop us (unless we let him).

People are much the same as they ever were – spiritual blindness stops them turning to the Lord (2 Cor.4:4).

The one thing that has changed, however, is the Church. One element in particular seems pertinent. In John 17 when Jesus prayed for us who "come after" His disciples, He chose just one thing to pray: that we would be one. Psalm 133:3 says that where there is unity, God "commands a blessing". Unity is clearly of paramount importance. It has a spiritual effect. It is difficult to imagine that the Church can wield the power and authority she has effectively without genuine unity.

3. Repentance prevents the enemy from holding us back

We often cry out to God to send revival as if He somehow needs to be persuaded to do it. What more does God need to do to turn this situation around? Nothing!

God has defined clear lines of responsibility and won't do for us things that He has given us to do. I often wonder whether He isn't saying something along the lines of, "I've done my part. You have everything you need. Stop asking me for more. Just do your part!"

Biblically there is just one Church in an area. Is the one Church in your area united? Probably not. Disunity is a sin. Sin gives the enemy a foothold, a base of operations, a means to hold us back.



I have seen dramatic changes as individuals have learned to deal with sin through repentance using the Steps To Freedom. I have seen astonishing turnarounds in churches as leadership teams have repented of corporate sin using our "Setting Your Church Free" process.

Imagine what would happen if the leaders of the one Church in your area came together in genuine unity, asked the Lord to show them any outstanding sin issues in the one Church (including disunity) and then resolved them through repentance.

Would that not return us to the position of the early Church which had no division and no corporate sin (at least to start with)? Would that not remove every foothold of the enemy and enable us to go forward in real spiritual blessing as we continue in obedience to God? Would that not change the spiritual atmosphere so that those who are in spiritual blindness see the truth?

How could it not?

Our role is to help leaders of the one Church light the blue touch paper.
